### NEW ELECTRONICS BAN

Effective September 1, 2010, 2009 Wisconsin Act 50 prohibits disposal of certain electronic devices in Wisconsin landfills, burning in an incineration facility, or placing these devices in a container intended for disposal or incineration [s.287207(5), Wis. Stats.]. This ban does not require a solid waste treatment or disposal facility to retrieve a consumer video display device (a television or computer monitor with a tube or a screen that is at least 7 inches in its longest diagonal measurement) if doing so is impractical or would jeopardize the health or safety of a worker, or if the device has been damaged to the extent that recycling is no longer practical or feasible [(s.287.07(5)(b), Wis. Stats.]. Electronic devices included in the ban are computers, printers, video display devices, peripherals, fax machines, DVD players, VCRs, and other video players (i.e. DVRs).

### 2010 STREET DEPARTMENT YARD WASTE DROP-OFF

The City of Kaukauna will provide yard waste drop-off for \$1/bag or can on the following Thursdays and Saturdays at 340 W. Third Street next to the former recycling area:

Residents will be required to purchase a voucher from the Clerk/Treasurer's Office at 201 W. Second Street before dropping off yard waste. **Cash will not be accepted at the drop-off point.** The vouchers will be sold in \$5 increments and will be good for the disposal of five bags or cans of yard waste. All yard waste must be in bags or cans. No loose yard waste will be accepted. The yard waste attendant will validate vouchers.

Grass clippings will be accepted. However, the City of Kaukauna and the DNR encourage residents to leave grass clippings on the lawn. Lawn clippings are a good source of fertilizer and can also make excellent compost.

**HOMEOWNERS USING HEAVY EQUIPMENT**

Any homeowners planning a construction project within the City limits should be advised of the following City policies:



- Any contractor doing new or replacement work is required to remove and dispose of all construction debris at his/her expense.
- A homeowner using heavy equipment (backhoe, tractor, skid steer, etc.) is considered a contractor. Therefore, they are responsible for debris removal. The City will **not** pick up this debris.

**BRUSH ORDINANCE**

**BRUSH IS COLLECTED DURING THE SECOND FULL WEEK OF EACH MONTH ON YOUR REGULAR GARBAGE PICK-UP DAY**

- Must be a minimum of 2' and a maximum of 6' in length. Brush 2'-4' in length must be bundled and secured with twine or string. Bundles and/or branches shall not exceed 50# in weight. Bundles shall not be greater than 18" in diameter. Side branches on larger limbs shall be removed.
- Must be placed at curb or alley line no more than 24 hours prior to the time of collection. Maximum pile height shall not exceed 4'. Butt ends shall face the roadway.
- Roots shall be removed from brush.
- Brush shall only be placed for collection by owner or occupant who performed the brush removal, not by any contractor performing such work. Contractor is responsible for removal of any brush created by his/her work.
- Brush placed for collection in violation of these requirements will not be collected.

**RECYCLING REMINDER**



State and local laws require everyone in Wisconsin to recycle newspaper, magazines, cardboard, glass/plastic/aluminum/steel food and beverage containers, tires, yard waste, appliances, motor oil, lead acid batteries and office paper. Outagamie County Residents: Please remember to place recyclables in a reusable container between 15-33 gallons in size with exterior handles, not exceeding 50#, and identified with an Outagamie County recycling decal. Recyclables should NOT be placed in plastic bags. Please call 920-832-5277 for a recycling decal.

**TIRE COLLECTION**

The City of Kaukauna will be conducting fall tire collection the week of September 20-23 on your normal garbage collection day. The Outagamie County Division of Solid Waste has agreed to collect tires from municipalities during the week of September 20-23 at no charge. Significant savings will be realized by the City of Kaukauna by having our tire collection coincide with the County's free drop-off.



Kaukauna Street Department will collect a maximum of four (4) tires from residential customers only and must have rims removed. Tires still mounted on rims will **NOT** be picked up.

***PLEASE TRIM YOUR STREET TREES!*** City ordinance requires that tree limbs are to be kept trimmed to provide a minimum of 8' of clearance above sidewalks and 12' above streets. This clearance is needed so that pedestrians can safely use the public sidewalk. Brush collection by the City continues to be the second full week of every month. **NOXIOUS WEED ORDINANCE**

**NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN** to each person who owns, occupies, or controls land in the City of Kaukauna: Ordinance 10.03 (6) of the Kaukauna Municipal Code requires that all noxious weeds and other rank growth of vegetation be kept to a height not to exceed one (1) foot. Exceptions are given to vacant lots in the Industrial Park and to other lots in the City that are located on a face block where less than 50% of the face block is occupied.

Street Department crews will cut weeds and rank growth on lots that are in violation. The work will be done periodically throughout the summer as manpower allows. A minimum charge of \$70 will be applied to the property for each occurrence that requires the City to cut the vegetation.
